

Procedures for sanitizing the church between masses

Please see our operating procedures for details on entering the church, the mass and the exiting of the church. The church is set up in a grid form as to keep 6' social distancing guidelines at all times, See Photos.

All volunteers will take a section and disinfectant the pews and wipe them down. Gloves and masks will be worn and supplied by the church.

All door handles will be sanitized between masses.

All handrails will be sanitized between masses.

Restrooms will be sanitized between masses.

We have added dispensers and flushable toilet seat covers in all stalls and restrooms with a toilet.

All volunteers will be trained in how to remove gloves properly and dispose of them after each use.

Volunteers will wash hands before and after sanitizing according to CDC guidelines.

Volunteers will be stationed in the parking lot and church in order to maintain government guidelines for social distancing.

No water at the entrances or in the font.

If someone shows signs of the flu they will be asked to return to their home and watch it on livestream.

If a parishioner gets sick during the mass, that section of the church will be shut down until we can clean that area and properly sterilize it. We do have body fluid clean up kits on hand with all the protective gear needed and proper disposal instructions.

Volunteers will ask parishioners for their names as they enter the church with contact information. We are thinking of recording this information with a video camera for speed and accuracy. At this time we will also take their temperature.

Signs will be posted with instructions on entering the church.

Signs will be posted and we will announce how to exit the church after mass has concluded.

We will livestream instructions and a demo on what mass will look like.

Parishioners will receive an email with all of these instructions.

Volunteers will start their training on Friday 5/22/2020.
